Home Haemo Machines

Four more patients have been able to start home dialysis as a result of AKPA funding dialysis machines.

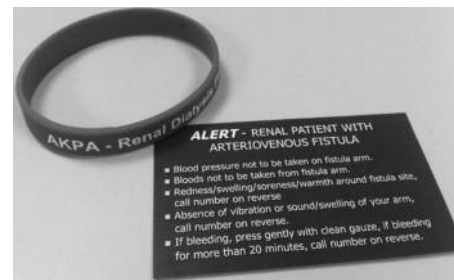
NHS budget cuts had restricted the planned expansion of Home Haemodialysis by Addenbrooke's Home Therapies group. But after receiving a generous legacy, AKPA were able to help by funding four reconditioned machines. This enabled the group's home dialysis programme to get back on track.

Fistula Alert Bracelets

The staff in the dialysis unit would like to thank Addenbrooke's Kidney Patients Association (AKPA) for giving generous funding to purchase fistula alert bracelets for dialysis patients and those pre-dialysis patients with fistulas not yet in use.

For haemodialysis patients the ideal access to the bloodstream is via an Arterio Venous Fistula and it is a priority to preserve and protect this lifeline. To help achieve this patients are advised to wear a Fistula Alert Bracelet and carry a Fistula Alert Card.

The Fistula Alert Bracelets and Fistula Alert Cards are distributed to appropriate



patients at Addenbrooke's and the satellite units (Hinchingsbrooke, West Suffolk and Kings Lynn). If you have not received them and would like either, they can be obtained from Low Clearance

Exercise on Dialysis – *Exciting New Developments*

In recent weeks two exciting new developments have been initiated, which could benefit dialysis patients at Addenbrooke's and its Satellite Units.

First, Mr Sushant Jeurkar (Medical Team Lead Physiotherapist) contacted AKPA to find out about our interest in exercise on dialysis and this led to meetings between AKPA and Physiotherapy Department staff.

Sushant is currently planning to improve the inpatient physiotherapy services for Renal / Dialysis patients and Carly Readings, one of the Physiotherapy staff is currently doing a six-month rotation as Renal Physiotherapist looking after renal patients on the Medical wards.

Sushant intends to introduce exercise into patient treatment regimens and will

be applying to AKPA for funding early this spring. He is confident that introducing exercise on dialysis will bring clear health benefits for patients. And hopes that the outcomes of this research will persuade the Trust of the financial benefits too, as more patients have improved health outcomes and fewer associated complications.

Independently from this, just before Christmas, AKPA was contacted by John Saxton, Professor of Clinical Exercise Physiology at the University of East Anglia, Norwich. A team from Norwich is planning a major piece of research on exercise for dialysis patients called the PRIDE trial. Dr Alex Heaton who is leading on this research used to work at Addenbrooke's. Many older AKPA members will remember Dr Heaton from his days at Douglas House. The Norwich team is through to the final stage of an application for funding from the National Institute of Health Research (NIHR).

Professor Saxton picked up on AKPA's interest through the newspaper articles



on Barrie Mill's John O'Groats to Land's End ride. The Pride Trial is recruiting dialysis centres interested in taking part, and Professor Saxton has visited Addenbrooke's to meet some of the Physiotherapy and Renal Services staff. Dr Pritchard has stated that Addenbrooke's would be keen to take part if the NIHR grant is awarded. Everyone is now eagerly awaiting the end of March to learn if the application has been successful.

These two pieces of research are exciting opportunities to kick-start exercise for dialysis patients with the promise of vital staffing resources needed to get it off the ground!

Renal Patient View: Update



The Renal Patient View (RPV) database at Addenbrooke's is now even closer to launch.

Dr Afzal Chaudhry, Consultant Nephrologist and IT

Lead at Addenbrooke's, reports that it will be trialled after Easter and hopefully live by June. A small group of patient volunteers will be testing the system, prior to invitations going out to all renal patients.

Two articles related to RPV appeared in the recent **winter issue** of **NKF Kidney Life** magazine and may be of interest to our readers.

On p20, the *Medical Matters* section begins with a summary of a recent analysis of Renal Patient View (BMC Medical Informatics and Decision Making 2012;12:87). Two key points are:

“An analysis of Renal Patient View usage concludes that the system is popular, empowering patients and increasing their understanding of their kidney problems and treatment.”

“Neither patient nor staff responses indicate the RPV has made patients more anxious or increased workload for renal units beyond the time taken to enrol each patient.”

“You can share up to the minute details with other doctors and nurses when the unexpected occurs.”

On p16, on the *Donal's Question Time* page, Dr Donal O'Donoghue concludes his reply to a patient letter with some interesting comments on the value of signing up to RPV: “Every person with advanced kidney disease, on dialysis or with a kidney transplant has the right to see their own record and they can do this today by joining Renal Patient View. You can then share the up to the minute details with other doctors and nurses when the unexpected occurs. If you are not signed up you should be. I know some units are not as good as others are at promoting a patient centred approach and therefore from next April, in England, kidney teams will get a financial incentive to encourage uptake of Renal Patient View, in an effort to improve the situation where coverage is low. I would argue that it is not only your right under the constitution of the NHS, but that it is also your responsibility, not least to your donor and their family, to protect your ‘gift of life’ by signing up to Renal Patient View.”

Helping Patients Decide

A project to improve patient knowledge about renal replacement therapies was given a boost when Addenbrooke's Low Clearance team recently secured an NHS Kidney Care grant. The project aims to encourage patient use of the newly launched “Established Kidney Failure patient decision aids” (PDA) and we are grateful for their support.

These interactive internet tools enable patients to explore the pros and cons of different treatments (unit and home haemodialysis, different types of peritoneal dialysis and conservative management). Lifestyle preferences can be entered and opinions formed about available options. A summary can then be emailed to the patient, enabling them to discuss options in a more informed way with clinical staff.

As of April 2013 the tools will be available via the NHS Choices website. A paper version is also available, and both versions are being introduced in the Low Clearance and Nephrology clinics. Feedback will be collected, and anyone with an opinion about the tools, or a wish to be involved at a national level with the implementation of shared decision making, please contact me as below.

Those who attend clinic 12 will shortly see a new ‘kiosk’ in the waiting area. This is for patients to access the PDAs and other sources of information whilst waiting for appointments. Again, there will be the option of emailing yourself information for later reading and discussion with family and friends.

A further PDA for Advanced Kidney Disease, with information about planning for end of life care was developed nationally with Addenbrooke's Renal Unit input. It should join the other PDAs soon but is currently available at:

Jonathan Allen

Shortly after Christmas we received the sad news that Jonathan Allen, a long time supporter of AKPA had sadly died.

Jon was an early kidney and pancreas transplant recipient: he also lost his eyesight and suffered a leg amputation, but if you met Jon you would probably be unaware of any of that. Jon just got on with life. Often achieving things people without his disabilities would think twice about tackling.

I first met Jon in 1998, shortly after I became *Newsflash* editor. Sister Heather Cook suggested we attended an "AKPA Benefit Gig" organised by Jon in his home village of Great Bardfield. The event featured The Honeycombs, a sixties hit making pop group who Jon had persuaded to come out of retirement, with all proceeds going to AKPA.

Jon and his wife Angela organised all the evening's entertainment, the bar, raffle and supporting groups. And they went on to organise more "Bardfield Gigs". Jon set his own "fundraising targets" and with meticulous planning, and gentle persuasion of his wide circle of friends, raised considerable amounts of money for AKPA.

Jon's other fundraising activities for AKPA included selling large amounts of raffle tickets. Reliably, year after year, Jon sold more raffle tickets than anyone else. He once told me how he and Angela became friendly with their fellow bus passengers on shopping trips and how, near to Christmas, they managed to sell AKPA raffle tickets to most people on the bus. Jon's raffle ticket sales also included a large network of "friends and family" across the

country who regularly bought tickets from him.

Jon and Angela met when Jon was having his transplant in Addenbrooke's. They married shortly after at Gretna Green and were always very close in all they did.

Jon's interests included involvement with his local community, his vegetable garden, – beautifully straight rows with not a weed in sight. And home improvements – the last time I met him he was building a new garage.

I sometimes felt that Jon, although sightless, had a clearer vision of life than many sighted people. He will be sadly missed.

Our deepest condolences to Angela and all Jon's family.
